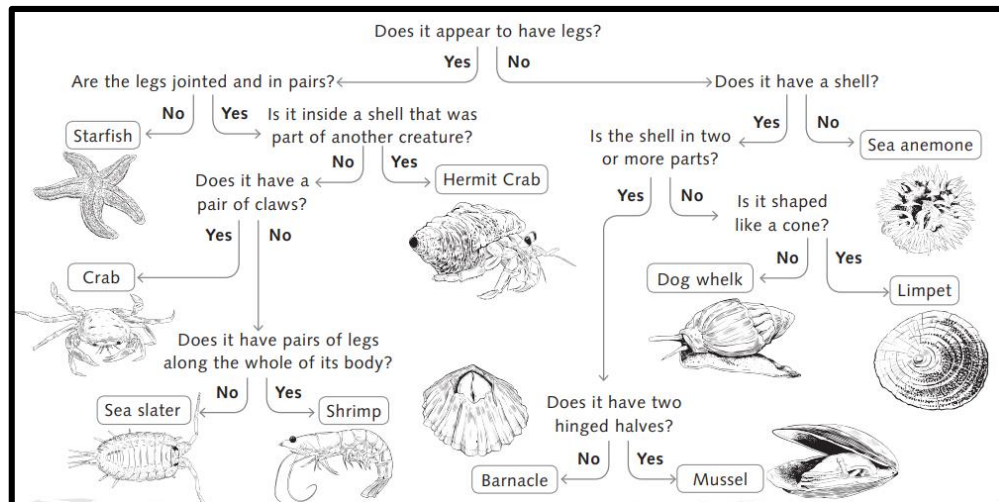


Vocabulary	
Classification	Assigning an item to a group based on characteristics they have in common.
Characteristics	A feature that helps to identify.
Invertebrate	An animal that has an internal skeleton.
Key	A way of sorting a small number of items using Yes/No questions.
Vertebrate	An animal that does not have an internal skeleton.
Warm-blooded	Having a body temperature that does not change whatever the surrounding temperature.
Cold-blooded	They are the same temperature as their surroundings.

<p><input type="checkbox"/> Fish</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have gills and fins. Covered in wet scales. Live in water. Are cold-blooded. Lay eggs. 	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Reptiles</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have lungs. Have dry, scaly skin. Young look like small adults. Are cold-blooded. Lay leathery eggs.
<p><input type="checkbox"/> Birds</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have lungs. Have feathers and beaks. Have two legs and two wings. Are warm-blooded. Lay eggs with hard shells. 	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Mammals</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have lungs. Have hair or fur. Have different types of teeth. Are warm-blooded. Give birth and produce milk.
<p><input type="checkbox"/> Amphibians</p> <p>Young amphibians:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Look different from their parents. Have gills. 	<p>Adult amphibians:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lay eggs in water. Have lungs. Have skin with no hair, feathers or scales. Are cold-blooded.
